BLUE AND GOLD STAR SERVICE BANNERS PROGRAM

Comrades, Sisters, and Brothers,

Charles Evering VFW Post 6506 has embraced a program that was widely used during World Wars I and II; namely, the display of Blue and Gold Star Service Banners to be used by families who have a loved one serving (or have served) in the armed forces during the “War on Terrorism”. The banner is displayed in the front window of a home to show a family’s pride in their loved one.



The Blue or Gold Star Service Banner is an 8 by 16-inch white field with a blue or gold star(s) sewn onto a red banner.

The Blue Star banner represents one family member serving (or who has served) in the armed forces. A banner can have up to five stars, signifying that five members of that family have served on active duty.

If the individual symbolized is killed or dies while serving the star representing that individual will have superimposed on it a gold star of smaller size so that the blue forms a border.

The program is limited to the period commonly referred to as the “War on Terrorism”.

The cost for purchasing the banner will be borne solely by your post and is open to all members of VFW Post 6506. The procedure for securing the banner is as follows:

The member must provide a letter to Program Chairman Ron Hall giving the full name of service member and type of banner required, as well as the combat area. Combat areas includes both foreign and domestic. The letter must also give the name and address of the individual who will present the banner to the veteran or his/her family, as the case may be.

Upon receipt of letter, Program Chairman will mail the appropriate banner to the requestor, along with a Certificate of Appreciation which names the service member.

BRIEF HISTORY

The Blue Star Service Banner was designed and patented in 1917 by World War I Army Capt. Robert L. Queissner of the 5th Ohio Infantry who had two sons serving on the front line. It quickly became the unofficial symbol of a child in the service.

On Sept. 24, 1917, an Ohio congressman read the following into the Congressional Record: “...The mayor of Cleveland, the Chamber of Commerce and the governor of Ohio have adopted this service flag. The world should know of those who give so much for liberty. The dearest thing in all the world to a father and mother - their children.”

During World War II, the Department of War issued specifications on the manufacture of the flag as well as guidelines indicating when and by whom the Service flag could be flown.
